Dear Students, Families, and Staff,

I am writing to inform you that a person affiliated with Presque Isle High School has tested positive for the coronavirus (COVID-19). Currently, members of the MSAD #1 Health Services department are notifying close contacts of the individual who has tested positive and will be directing students and staff who are considered close contacts to quarantine for 10 days. If you are not contacted, your student is not considered a close contact.

The Presque Isle High School individual who tested positive was last in school on Monday, February 1. We have approximately 33 students and 2 staff members considered as close contacts to that individual. These close contacts will be out of quarantine and welcomed back at school on Friday, February 12.

We have determined that we have the appropriate number of substitute staff members to cover for the staff members who are considered close contacts at Presque Isle High School, **all MSAD #1 schools will be open for in-person instruction and will resume their regular schedules.**

MSAD #1 officials have been in contact with the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and are following the protocols and procedures outlined for schools to follow when a case of the coronavirus occurs in a school. The CDC recommends that close contacts of a person who tests positive for the coronavirus should quarantine for 10 days. The CDC also recommends that the members of Presque Isle High School who are not considered close contacts should monitor for symptoms but may resume normal daily activities.

COVID-19 is a respiratory illness that ranges from mild to severe. The virus mainly spreads when an infected person coughs or sneezes and an uninfected person breathes in the virus. Signs and symptoms include:

- fever or chills
- cough
- shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- fatigue
- muscle or body aches
- headache
- sore throat
- new loss of taste or smell
- congestion or runny nose
- nausea or vomiting
- diarrhea
