Dear Students, Families, and Staff,

I am writing to inform you that two people affiliated with Presque Isle High School have tested positive for the coronavirus (COVID-19).

Members of the MSAD #1 Health Services department have notified the students considered close contacts to the individuals who tested positive for the coronavirus. If you have not been contacted, your student is not considered a close contact. We have approximately 8 students who are considered close contacts and will need to quarantine for 10 days. 4 additional students are considered close contacts but will not need to quarantine due to the fact that they have been fully vaccinated. The quarantine recommendation is ten days from last possible contact with the individual who tested positive for COVID. These close contacts will be out of ten-day quarantine and are welcome back to school on Monday, August 30.

The staff members who are considered close contacts to the positive case at Presque Isle High School will not need to quarantine due to the fact that staff members who were within close proximity to the positive case have been fully vaccinated. As a result, **Presque Isle High School will remain open for in-person instruction**

MSAD #1 officials have been in contact with the Maine Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and are following the protocols and procedures outlined for schools to follow when a case of the coronavirus occurs in a school. The CDC recommends that close contacts of a person who tests positive for the coronavirus should quarantine for 10 days.

COVID-19 is a respiratory illness that ranges from mild to severe. The virus mainly spreads when an infected person coughs or sneezes and an uninfected person breathes in the virus. Signs and symptoms include:

- fever or chills
- cough
- shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- fatigue
- muscle or body aches
- headache
- sore throat
- new loss of taste or smell
- congestion or runny nose
- nausea or vomiting
- diarrhea
